## SERVING OUR VETERANS

For the 116th Congress, Congressman Lamb was appointed to the House Veterans' Affairs Committee and elected to serve as Vice Chair. The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has the fourth largest veteran population in the U.S., with more than 800,000 living veterans, and the Congressman is committed to ensuring that every veteran in our state gets the care, support and opportunities they've earned. Our local veterans face many issues every day, and Congressman Lamb will continue to work on bipartisan legislation to support veterans.



Veterans come out of the military with a wide range of skills and the best training in the world. They shouldn't be struggling to find jobs in the civilian workforce, especially not when businesses are struggling to fill high-demand, high-paying jobs in STEM-related industries. Congressman Lamb co-authored the **Supporting Veterans in STEM Careers Act (H.R. 425)**, a bipartisan bill that encourages veterans to study and pursue careers in STEM fields, and directs the National Science Foundation (NSF) to develop a comprehensive outreach plan to increase veteran participation in its STEM programs. This bill, which passed the House unanimously in February, connects the dots to help veterans compete for some of the best jobs in the 21st century.

Congressman Lamb is an official partner of the **Vietnam War 50th Commemoration**, a program developed by the Department of Defense to thank and honor Vietnam veterans and their families for their contribution to the war effort and community. ## FIGHTING FOR THE FUTURE OF OUR FAMILIES

Social Security isn't an entitlement, it is the insurance that working Americans have paid for with every paycheck. In commemoration of President Franklin Delano Roosevelt's birthday in January, Congressman Lamb joined as an original cosponsor of **Social Security 2100 Act (H.R. 860)**, to enhance and expand Social Security for current retirees and future generations. Social Security is the most important source of retirement income for 4 out of 5 seniors. With commonsense steps like those in the Social Security 2100 Act, Congressman Lamb believes we can improve benefits while ensuring Social Security remains fiscally strong throughout the century.

Working families should not have to choose between going to appointments or taking care of their children. Congressman Lamb cosponsored the **Child Care for Working Families Act (H.R. 1364)**, to provide high-quality affordable child care to working families which caps the amount of money families will have to pay out of pocket for child care.



Congressman Lamb also cosponsored the **Bank on Students Emergency Loan Refinancing Act (H.R. 1707)**, to allow young people burdened by student debt to refinance their loans to lower their interest rates.

### THE POWER ACT

The opioid crisis is affecting communities across our region and the country. Congressman Lamb introduced bipartisan legislation to assist state and local law enforcement obtain drug screening devices used by federal law enforcement. The **Providing Officers With Electronic Resources (POWER) Act (H.R. 2070)** establishes a new grant program at the Department of Justice to help law enforcement agencies secure these high-tech, portable chemical screening devices, also known as interdiction devices, that assist officers in the detection of fentanyl and other dangerous drugs. Congressman Lamb is also a member of the bipartisan Heroin and Opioids Task Force.

## SUPPORTING OUR REGION'S WORKERS

Earlier this year, Congressman Lamb was appointed Chairman of the bipartisan **Congressional Steel Caucus**. America produces the world's best steel, and southwestern Pennsylvania produces the world's best steelworkers. In this role, Congressman Lamb is working with colleagues from both parties to help strengthen the steel industry to protect American jobs and American workers.




Congressman Lamb believes we have an obligation to do everything in our power to ensure that our economy benefits everyone, and leaves no one behind. Congressman Lamb has worked with Senator Casey (D-PA) to introduce the bicameral **Tax Fairness for Workers Act (H.R. 2103)**, legislation that would reinstate the deduction for unreimbursed employee expenses and make the deduction for union dues available for all filers, even if they don't itemize their deductions.



# INVESTING IN AGING INFRASTRUCTURE



Congressman Lamb knows that our aging infrastructure is holding back our economy and slowing Pittsburgh's growth. As the easternmost gateway of the Inland Waterways System, the Port of Pittsburgh moves 27 million tons of cargo through the locks and dams in our region, which generates an estimated \$6.5 billion of economic impact and supports almost 40,000 jobs.



The three regional locks that are included in the Upper Ohio Navigation Project, the Emsworth, Dashields, and Montgomery Locks, are the oldest locks in the entire Ohio River system. Congressman Lamb is leading efforts in Washington, DC to increase funding levels for critical infrastructure programs.
